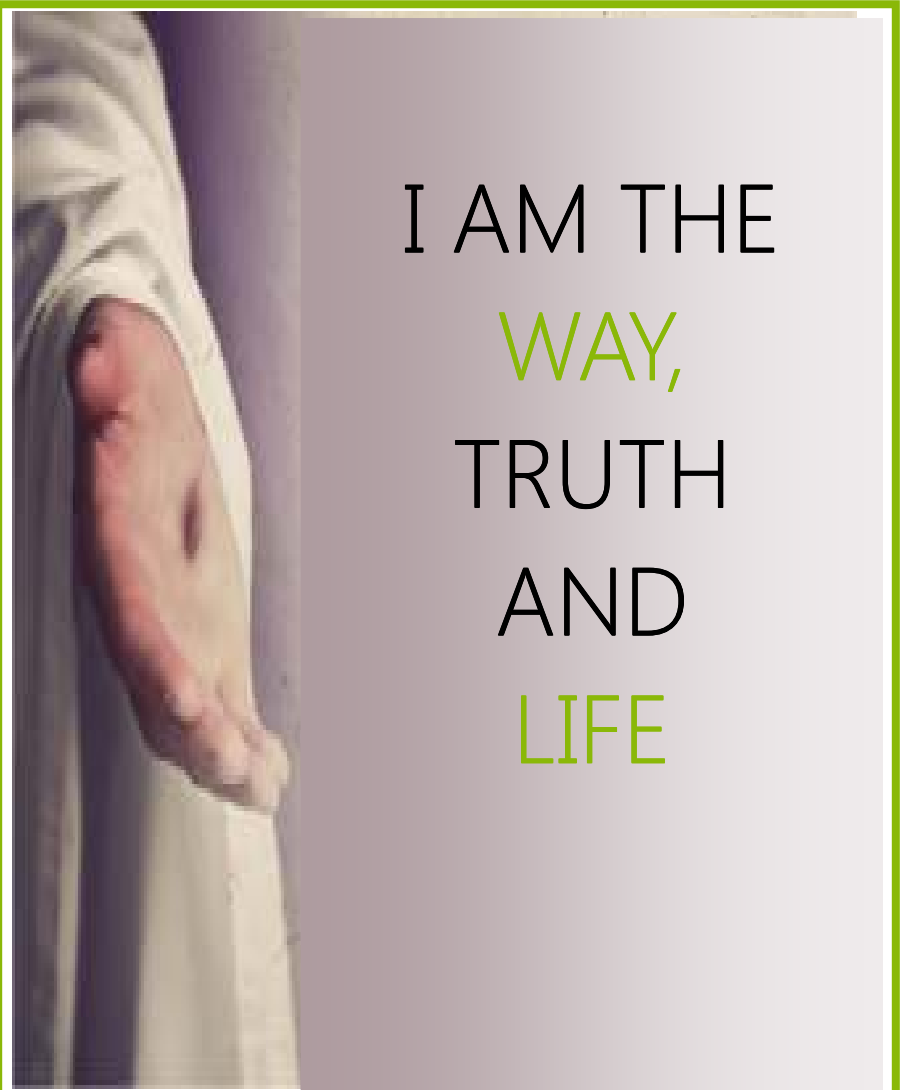

## **FROM FR. LUYEN’S DESK**

### **“Happy Mother’s Day to all the mothers, grandmothers, god-mothers, and mothers-to-be! “**

Thanks for all the ways you have said “yes” to your special God-given vocation as mother to your children, family, and those who are in your care as the role of a mother. It’s a holy calling. Thanks for exemplifying the gift of a mother’s love - a reflection of what God’s love is like! We remember all mothers, grandmothers and any woman who has played a motherly role for us (living and deceased) in the intention of the Masses this weekend, with prayers of thanksgiving for the gift of our mother. God bless you today and always!

Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup> marks the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the apparitions of the Blessed Mother to the 3 children at Fatima. Pope Francis is in Fatima this weekend and will mark the anniversary with the canonization of two of the children; Francisco and Jacinta Marto, who died in a flu epidemic two years after the apparitions. The Church continues to celebrate the message of Fatima with First Saturday devotions.

At Fatima, the Blessed Mother stressed the need for Prayer, (particularly the rosary), for peace in the world, deeper conversion to Christ and repentance for sin. At the heart of the message of Fatima is the message of the Gospel – and it’s as timely as ever!

#### **How might we celebrate this Jubilee of Fatima?**

During the apparitions in Fatima, and in her third apparition, Mary revealed to the three shepherd children what came to be known as The Great Secret of Fatima.

- ◆ The first secret was a vision of hell which Mary allowed the children to see.
- ◆ The second was a statement that World War I would end, and a prediction of another war that would start during the reign of Pius XI, if people continued to offend God and if Russia were not consecrated to her Immaculate Heart.
- ◆ The third secret of Fatima refers to a message during the apparitions predicting suffering and persecution of the Pope and the Church.

According to Sr. Lucia, one of the visionaries who lived until 2005, the consecration was completed during the pontificate of St. John Paul II, who several times attempted to fulfill the requirements of the Russia consecration. It was finally considered fully complete after the consecration he made on March 25<sup>th</sup>, 1984 as confirmed by Sr. Lucia.

We are invited to consecrate ourselves and our families to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In the past, as St. Pope John Paul II, consecrated the world to Mary, and this week the Bishops of Canada are invited to consecrate the country to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary as part of the celebrations marking the 150th anniversary of Confederation. Each Bishop is invited to consecrate his individual Diocese to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Our parish at St. Edward’s has gone ahead of them. We just started last Thursday, sessions to prepare ourselves to the Marian Consecration, We are using the program “33 Days to Morning Glory “ retreat talks by Fr. Michael Gaitly, MC. Then we will have a Marian Consecration in the middle of June. If you want to consecrate yourselves and your families to this special Event, please call Parish office. We will meet again Next Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m.

- ◆ Discover or rediscover First Saturday Mass and Devotions.

the Banner in the Foyer above the main entrance to the Worship area?

The final word, "GO", has been added.

This word represents the Dismissal Rite in the Mass. It is a word used in the final blessing when the priest says "**Go in peace to love and serve the Lord**" and we respond "**Thanks be to God**". It is symbolized by the candle...the light of Christ...which we are asked to take into our world and our daily lives; to share with all those we encounter and to bring God's love and caring to a world in need. So at Mass,

**we COME, we LISTEN, we DO**

**and then we GO to share what we have heard and received in all that we do and with all whom we encounter.**

At the final session of Children's Faith Formation this year, after listening to a reading from the Gospel of Matthew (Matthew 25:34-40) and discussing what it means to "**serve the Lord**", we celebrated a special ritual. The lights were dimmed. Each child and adult present was asked to come forward with the candle they had received. Their candle was then lit from the Pascal Candle (also known as the Easter Candle or the Christ Candle) and given back to them with the words:

(Name): **Go, and walk always as a child of the light!**

When all the candles had been lit, the Worship area wasn't so dark anymore.

Thank you to all the children, their parents and families, their sponsors; to Fr. Luyen, the catechists and to all who had a part in the Children's Faith Formation Program this past year. Together, we became "companions on the journey" and are 'no longer strangers to each other; no longer strangers in God's house;". Thank you for your dedication, your faithfulness to the program and your commitment to sharing our Faith with each other. It has been a pleasure journeying with you. May the Lord continue to lead and guide all of you on your continuing lifelong journey of faith. God bless.

## Fatima 100 years celebration



Upon Pope Francis' trip to Fatima this week he will use this special occasion of the 100th Anniversary of Our Lady's appearance to 3 Portuguese children to canonize 2 of them. Jacinta and her brother Francisco Marto died at the age of 9 and 10 years. They will become the youngest children to be recognized as Saints.

Our Lady appeared to the children between May 13, 1917 to October 13, 1917. The final apparition was witnessed by Jacinta, Francisco and their cousin Lucia dos Santos and it was reported that up to 100,000 people were present also.

Two miracles attributed to Jacinta and Francisco have been recognized by the Prefect of the Congregation for Saints. This entitles them to Saint-hood.

Lucia dos Santos became a Carmelite nun and wrote memoirs of the apparitions. On February 13th, 2005 Lucia died at the age of 97 years. Pope Benedict XVI announced the case of Sr. Lucia and he waived the 5 years waiting period established by the ecclesiastical law before opening a case for her beatification, this rule was also dispensed in the causes for Mother Teresa of Calcutta and Pope John Paul II. Lucia was beatified in 2008. Through the eyes of many Lucia is already a Saint.

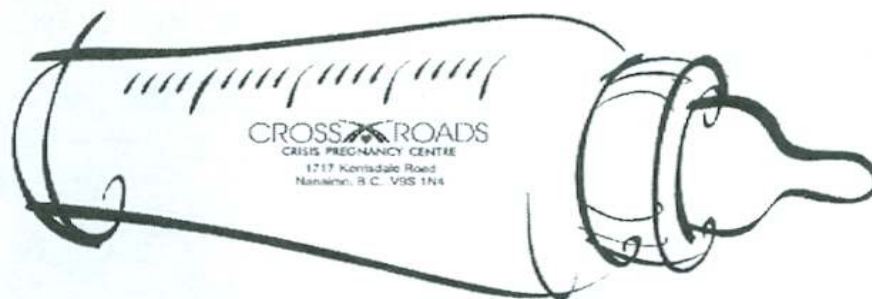
