NOTES

“Thus it is written.” “He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.” “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you — that everything about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms must be fulfilled.” With these words, Jesus reveals Himself as the fulfillment of so many of the prophecies of the Old Testament, the fulfillment of most of the types of the Old Testament, and the fulfillment of most of the promises of God in the Old Testament. If this is true, and it is, then the Old Testament becomes one of the principle means for understanding who Jesus is and what He means for our lives. Since He is the most important person in our lives, save for the Father and the Spirit, it becomes vitally important that we come to know Him through the Old Testament. For us, to know Him is to love Him, and to love Him is to want to know Him more deeply and more intimately. Our freedom comes from living heart to heart, mind to mind, body to body, with Jesus. And what glorious freedom it is - to be alive with (and truly in) Jesus. Jesus came to unite us to Himself and the Father through the Spirit. We do not quite know what “unite” means. To experience friendship helps us somewhat to understand what it means to be united to another person. To experience a good marriage also helps us to understand what it means to be united to another person. To experience fatherhood or motherhood can also help. Again, Jesus came to unite us to Himself and the Father through the Spirit. In His incarnation Jesus united Himself to us in our humanity. In Jesus’ resurrection He united us to Him in His divinity. Through His death and resurrection Jesus completed the work of our salvation that He had begun in the womb of Mary. For this we rejoice wholeheartedly.

Christ is Risen. Alleluia!

The 2018 BC Summer Games Games Food Services Directorate is responsible for feeding the 2500 athletes and ~900 coaches and other adults helping with the teams. We provide banquet style breakfasts and dinners as well as box lunches for all meals July 19-22. It is estimated that we will need almost 500 volunteers in this area. It provides an opportunity for youth and adults to assist in making and serving nutritious and appealing meals to fuel the athletes and their adult support people. No experience is required as there will be on site supervisory volunteers present during the making of the meals and the serving. Volunteers under age 19 will need to fill in a parental permission sheet when registering at www.bcgames.org

A Food Safe Level 1 is not required as the supervisors will be certified, however it is an asset for anyone interested in this area. Ranges of functions include, cooks and preparation volunteers as well as a variety of food serving functions including, servers, bus people, set-up and take down staff and, cleaners. The box lunches will be delivered to a variety of off-site locations and we are looking for individuals with vans to transport the meals during the games. We are asking for people to volunteer for at least 8 hours, which could be one 8 hour shift or two 4 hour shifts. We would of course be very appreciative for people who could help us all 4 days of the game.
